ACTORS STRIKE HALTS FILMS/TV PRODUCTIONS

On July 14, 2023, the American actors' union SAG–AFTRA went on strike over an ongoing labor dispute with the Alliance of Motion Picture and Television Producers (AMPTP). It has coincided with a Writers Guild of America (WGA) strike as part of broader Hollywood labor disputes.

The strike marks the first time that actors have initiated a labor dispute in the U.S. since the 1980 actors strike and the first time that actors and writers have walked out simultaneously since 1960. Both the 2023 SAG–AFTRA and WGA labor disputes have contributed to the biggest interruption to the American television and film industries since the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020.

Many actors made a show of solidarity on the writers' picket lines, including Fran Drescher, the Screen Actors Guild-American Federation of Television and Radio Artists president and former star of "The Nanny." The union's 65,000-member actors' branch will now formally join them as fellow strikers.

The two guilds have similar issues with studios and streaming services. They are concerned about contracts keeping up with inflation, residual payments in the streaming era and putting up guardrails against the use of artificial intelligence mimicking their work on film and television shows.

Productions likely to be affected by the strike include sequels to the Avatar, Deadpool and Gladiator franchises, as well as upcoming seasons of shows such as Stranger Things, Family Guy and The Simpsons.

Red-carpet premieres, promotional interviews and events including the Emmys and Comic-Con, have already been halted, rescheduled or scaled back, as actors will not appear in films or even promote movies during the stoppage. - *AP/other news sources*.

Key US official calls for tech companies to 'do something' about AI

The director of the leading U.S. cybersecurity agency has a message for scientists and top technology company officials who are warning that artificial intelligence could lead to the end of humankind: **Take action.**

"If you actually think that these capabilities can lead to extinction of humanity, well, let's come together and do something about it," the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency's Jen Easterly told an Axios News Shapers event in Washington. "Think about what you can do to slow this down."

The comments by the CISA di-

rector come just a day after more than 350 researchers and technology executives issued a one-sentence warning about the dangers of artificial intelligence, or Al.

"Mitigating the risk of extinction from Al should be a global priority alongside other societal-scale risks such as pandemics and nuclear war," they said in a post on the website for the Center for Al Safety.

Those signing onto the warning included the co-founder and CEO of OpenAI, the company behind Chat GPT, Microsoft's chief technology officer, the CEO of Google's AI research lab and

Geoffrey Hinton, sometimes called "the godfather of artificial intelligence."

Hinton, notably, quit his job at Google earlier in May to focus on warning others of the dangers of Al.

U.S. government officials, like CI-SA's Easterly, have likewise been warning about the dangers posed by AI.

"Al will be the most powerful capability of our time," Easterly told students at Vanderbilt University during a speech earlier this month.

"While one person will use this technology to plan a dinner party, another will use the capability to plan a cyberattack or a terrorist attack," she said. - VOA

NEW YORK -- Tony Bennett, born Anthony Dominick Benedetto in Astoria, Queens on August 3rd, 1926, has passed away in his hometown of New York City at the age of 96 earlier today. The beloved singer, who was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease in 2016, is survived by his wife, Susan Benedetto, his two sons, Danny and Dae Bennett, his daughters Johanna Bennett and Antonia Bennett and 9 grandchildren. The 20-time Grammy winning singer and humanitarian bridged generations during his career that spanned over 7 decades. - PRNewswire

HEATWAVES SHOW IMPORTANCE OF HEALTH EARLY WARNINGS & ACTION PLANS

The World Meteorological Organization is stepping up efforts to strengthen heat-health early warnings and integrated action plans for heatwaves, which are amongst the deadliest natural hazards. Heat is a rapidly growing health risk, due to burgeoning urbanisation, an increase in high temperature extremes, and demographic changes in countries with ageing populations. Hundreds of thousands of people die from preventable heat-related causes each year.

Global temperatures have been at unprecedented levels for several weeks. The extensive and intense heatwaves this year are alarming, but not surprising because unfortunately the conditions being observed are in accordance with projections from the Intergovernmental Panel on

Climate Change.

A new study published last week, calculated last summer in Europe alone 60,000 additional people died due to extreme heat. Experts and governments consider this a conservative estimate.

There is currently a simultaneous heatwave phenomenon occuring, with temperatures in North America, parts of Asia, and across North Africa and the Mediterranean above 40°C for a prolonged number of days this week. These types of events are very concerning and have increased sixfold since the 1980s.

The recently declared El Nino is only expected to amplify the occurrence and intensity of such extreme heat events and impacts on human health and livelihoods. - WMO

USPS to release " Thinking of You" stamps



I'ne U.S. Postal Service will release five new stamps to help people send a note of celebration, gratitude or just to say hi. These stamps let those we care about know that we're thinking of them and affirm our love and affection.

The first-day-of-issue event for the Thinking of You Forever stamps will be held at the Great American Stamp Show in partnership with the American Philatelic Society, on Friday, August 11, 2023.

Officials say they're meant to capture the excitement and delight of receiving a card in the mail meant just for you.

Greg Breeding, an art director for USPS, designed the stamps with artwork by Ellen Surrey. The stamps, meaning they will always be equal to the current First-Class Mail one-ounce price.

AG Moody called Zuckerberg to testify on use of Meta in Florida human trafficking cases

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody is inviting Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg to testify before the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking about the results of a concerning Florida human trafficking survey and other recent reports that showed more than half of all reported instances of social media platform use in Florida trafficking cases, since 2019, involved Meta platforms—Facebook, Instagram, Messenger and WhatsApp. The Attorney General wants to know what Meta plans to do to stop human traffickers from using its platforms to advance this horrific crime.

U.S. Supreme Court strikes down Biden student loan forgiveness program

SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH – The U.S. Supreme Court on July 3rd closed its term with a monumental opinion in Biden v. Nebraska, ruling that the President's efforts to cancel student debts unilaterally were unlawful under the HEROES Act. Attorney General Sean D. Reyes co-led a 17-state amicus brief to the Court in support of Nebraska. The case involved a challenge brought by a coalition of six states, led by Nebraska, over the White House's action to clear approximately \$430 billion in student debt principal under the auspices of the Higher Education Relief Opportunities for Students Act of 2003 (HEROES Act).

Texan sentenced to 90 consecutive life sentences for 2019 mass shooting in Walmart in El Paso that killed 23

A Texas man was sentenced to 90 consecutive life sentences in prison for carrying out a mass shooting at the Cielo Vista Walmart in El Paso, Texas, on Aug. 3, 2019, killing 23 people and injuring 22 more. On Feb. 8, Patrick Wood Crusius, 24, pleaded guilty to a 90-count indictment with 45 counts of violating the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd Jr. Hate Crimes Prevention Act and 45 counts of using a firearm during and in relation to crimes of violence. Crusius was also sentenced for 22 counts of hate crime acts that caused bodily injury and involved attempts to kill 22 people injured in the shooting.

\$130K in unreported currrency seized from travelers

STERLING, Va. – U.S. Customs and Border Protection officers seized nearly \$130,000 in unreported currency from four groups of departing international travelers recently at Washington Dulles International Airport.

There is no limit to how much currency or other monetary instruments travelers may bring to or take out of the United States. However, federal law requires travelers to report all currency of \$10,000 or greater to a CBP officer and complete U.S. Treasury Department Report of International Transportation of Currency or Monetary Instruments.

OceanGate suspends exploration, commercial operations

WASHINGTON – OceanGate announced Thursday (July 6) on its website the suspension of "all exploration and commercial operations". The decision comes after the Titan submersible suffered a catastrophic implosion during a mission to the Titanic shipwreck last month, which left the company's CEO and four passengers dead.

Communication with the Titan submersible, owned and operated by OceanGate Expeditions, a private research and ocean adventure tourism company that made a tourist visit to the wreck of the Titanic ship in the Atlantic Ocean on June 18, was cut off shortly after the dive. Studies determined that the submersible imploded and sank killing the five onboard. (*Anadolu*)



NASA's space telescope discovers oldest supermassive black hole

ANKARA - On July 7, The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) said that its James Webb Space Telescope has discovered the oldest supermassive black hole in the center of the CEERS 1019 galaxy.

According to the US space agency, the black hole was shaped only 570 million years after the Big Bang and has a mass of 9 million times the sun.

The US space agency also said the scientists have "easily shaken out" by two more black holes that are "also on the smaller side, and existed 1 and 1.1 billion years after the big bang."

The James Webb telescope also identified 11 galaxies that existed when the universe was 470 to 675 million years old.

NASA further said the black hole

of CEERS 1019 that is discovered to be the oldest yet "clocks in at about 9 million solar masses, far less than other black holes that also existed in the early universe and were detected by other telescopes." (Anadolu)

New research indicates older workers will fill 150 million more jobs globally by 2030

NEW YORK -- A global study from Bain & Company has found that 150 million jobs will shift to workers over the age of 55 by 2030. That figure is nearly equal to the entire working population of the US. In the Group of Seven (G7) countries, Bain predicts these experienced workers will comprise a quarter of the workforce by the end of the decade—nearly 10 percentage points higher than in 2011.

This trend is most pronounced in high-income countries, such as Japan, Italy, Germany, China and Brazil.

Over the last two decades, fewer young people are entering the work-



force, and a long-term trend toward earlier retirement is slowly going into reverse. Forty-one percent of American workers now expect to work beyond age 65. Thirty years ago, it was 12%.

The UK increased its retirement age from 60 for women and 65 for men by pushing both up to 66, with a plan to move up further over time. In Japan, the government struggled to push the official retirement age from 60 to 61, leaving many firms to solve the problem by releasing workers at 60 and rehiring them on new contracts, often at reduced pay rates.

"There was an increase in retirements in some countries during the peak-Covid Great Resignation, but that moment is now looking more like the Great Sabbatical as those workers increasingly return to work," said James Root, partner at Bain & Company and co-chair of the firm's think tank, Bain Futures. "People work longer into their lives, yet we've found it rare to see organizations put programs in place to fully integrate older workers into their talent system." - PRNewswire







An Exclusive Interview by AWEE ABAYARI WITH DR. EDWARD L. FEREIRA, PhD



AWEE ABAYARI: Who was Edward L. Fereira then and who is Edward L. Fereira now?

DR. EDWARD L. FEREIRA, PhD: Growing up, I was very curious about a lot of things in life. I would spend a great amount of time reading and studying. Coming from a humble beginning of selling vegetables and Pilipino Comics, I always wanted to explore the world that was unknown to me, beyond my circumstances back then. I guess that propelled me to pursue science in college. It's the idea of discovery and finding out what's new and unfamiliar that charted the direction of my interests as a young adult.

When I look in the mirror now, I see a man who has branched out to various fields and disciplines. He is someone who has maintained a healthy sense of adventure, never afraid to try something new. But in addition to an insatiable curiosity, he has been taught by time the value of service. With all the life lessons and opportunities that I have had throughout my career, what I find now truly satisfying is sharing my knowledge and experience to help my country and the Filipinos, especially owners of small, micro, and medium enterprises. It brings me immense joy to be able to go to work knowing that, at the end of the day, I lead an organization that helps in building the nation.

AWEE ABAYARI: You first studied microbiology at the University of the Philippines, completed your Post Graduate studies in lunar microbiology, worked for NASA under the Apollo 11 "First Man Moon Landing" project and became known "as the first Filipino Lunar Microbiologist who examined the moon rocks brought back by Neil Armstrong, Edwin Aldrin, and Michael Collins." When did the turning point (from science to business) in your life occur sparking new diverse interests and why?

DR. EDWARD L. FEREIRA, PhD: While science and business may be two fields that are seemingly unrelated, I think they are very much intertwined. Scientists and business people flourish in experiences involving discovery and problem-solving. My shift from being a man of science to an entrepreneur grew gradually but not unexpectedly. Spending my early years as a scientist provided me the tools and practice to hone my skills. At the same time, I knew I could branch out using my unique background and training to be an entrepreneur. There weren't many Filipino microbiologists during that time, especially with the opportunity to work for a big and ground-breaking project such as the Apollo 11 mission. I put a lot of effort in building my mastery of the field before I jumped into another. And when I knew I was ready, that's when I pursued marketing, and then, eventually, forayed into business.

AWEE ABAYARI: After over 30 years of unparalleled accomplishments, a) What have you learned?

DR. EDWARD L. FEREIRA, PhD: One should never stop learning. While achievements are great, one shouldn't rest on them. For us to remain relevant, we must continue to challenge ourselves and be open to new ideas and ways of doing. In the export promotions industry where I find myself now, technology plays a huge role in reaching out to current and potential markets. Technology and its applications are very volatile. So I find the need to always learn and find ways how we can improve our work to promote the best Philippine products to the world.

AWEE ABAYARI: b) What have been your main challenges?

DR.EDWARD L. FEREIRA, PhD: I do believe that the people you work with are your best assets, but they too can be a source of challenges. So it is important for a leader to be able to inspire thought and action, to create an environment where people can contribute to your cause, move steadfastly, and maintain a growth mindset.

DR.EDWARD L. FEREIRA, **PhD:** As a science believer, I am empowered by empirical data, proven methodologies, and imminent technologies, fortified by decades of experiences, and invigorated by the intelligence and ingenuity of the creative workforce I lead.

Through hardwork and dedication, I became the first Filipino to be cited as a lunar microbiologist for my contribution to the American Space program by the Filipino Medical and Scientific Professional Association in the United States. It wasn't an easy feat, but relentlessness and grit, along with passion and curiosity, made it all possible.

DR. EDWARD L. FEREIRA, PhD: A personal practice has been to continuously explore possible business and contracting models, and look out for emerging trends and their resulting frameworks in order to stay ahead of the market. These values have been evident in my experiences as the President of Management Association of the Philippines (M.A.P.); President of Association for Philippine Entrepreneurship Corporation (A.P.E.C); and Chairman of Makati Business Development Council (Makati City Government) among others.

DR. EDWARD L. FEREIRA, PhD: As a leader, I am committed to develop, nurture, and promote local products, services, and talents by implementing an integrated approach to export marketing in close partnership with other government and private entities.



AWEE ABAYARI: What is FAITH and what role does it play in your life?

DR. EDWARD L. FEREIRA, **PhD:** I do believe in the presence of the divine. As a devout Catholic, I always have my faith help me make decisions without entertaining fear. Faith is the guiding force that allows me to make the impossible possible. I also associate faith with service. If you're asking for guidance and godly intervention, you should ask for things far bigger than your own needs. You should be able to ask for things that would make you most useful to other people. AWEE ABAYARI: Define success. Who are your role models that you consider successful and why?

DR. EDWARD L. FEREIRA, PhD: Success, for me, is the realization of the goals you have set for yourself and overcoming the obstacles along the way. Success is not just reaching the destination but conquering the journey as well, no matter how long it is. However, as years pass by, my definition of success has also evolved. True success means being able to think and achieve goals that are greater than your personal needs. It should be anchored on service and helping others using your own skills and capabilities.

As for role models, I've always looked up to Neil Armstrong, American astronaut and aeronautical engineer. I admire trailblazers simply because they face the greatest amount of challenges and dared to make the impossible into reality. I even named my son after him.

The other person I look up to is Steve Jobs. The late CEO of Apple redefined the way we live through technology. He is the perfect example of someone who bridged science, business, and even art to create an impact on the world.

AWEE ABAYARI: What countries have you visited aside from the Republic of Kazakhstan where you were assigned as the Special Envoy by the former President Rodrigo Duterte and what can you say would be the best message the Philippines can bring to the world based on your marketing expertise as a former President of the Management Association of the Philippines (MAP), the country's biggest business and management organization?



ELON MUSK LAUNCHES XAI

Announcing xAI

Team

Our team is led by Elon Musk, CEO of Tesla and SpaceX. We have previously worked at DeepMind, OpenAI, Google Research, Microsoft Research, Tesla, and the University of Toronto. Collectively we contributed some of the most widely used methods in the field, in particular the Adam optimizer, Batch Normalization, Layer Normalization, and the discovery of adversarial examples. We further introduced innovative techniques and analyses such as Transformer-XL, Autoformalization, the Memorizing Transformer, Batch Size Scaling, and µTransfer. We have worked on and led the development of some of the largest breakthroughs in the field including AlphaStar, AlphaCode, Inception, Minerva, GPT-3.5, and GPT-4.



Elon Musk discusses SpaceX Starlink in Malaysia with Prime Minister Anwar

Elon Musk and Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim discussed possibly bringing SpaceX's Starlink internet connection to the Southeast Asian country. The pair also discussed Tesla's interest and investment decisions in Malaysia.

Thus far, SpaceX's Starlink internet services are offered in Japan and the Philippines in Southeast Asia. Elon Musk's recent virtual meeting with Prime Minister Anwar suggests that Malaysia also wants Starlink internet services in the country.

The Malaysian Prime Minister believes Starlink internet could provide coverage to rural areas in the country. Tesla Malaysia already received approval to conduct business there, so SpaceX might have an easier time bringing Starlink into Malaysia.

Tesla announced the start of sales in Malaysia earlier this month with a planned launch event in Kuala Lumpur on July 20. The US-based automaker initiated Model Y pre-bookings earlier this week with a starting price of 199,000 ringgit (\$44,000).



Tesla Malaysia is expected to start deliveries next year. It will contribute to the country's goal to develop an EV ecosystem. Malaysia offers tax breaks to encourage EV adoption, like most countries that wish to transition to new energy vehicles. It aims to meet net zero emission goals by 2050.

Tesla Malaysia also plans to build a Supercharger Network in the country to support its EV transition.

PH MAINTAINS TIER 1 RANKING IN US TRAFFICKING REPORT


WASHINGTON D.C. - The Philippines has maintained its Tier 1 Ranking in the fight against human trafficking. In the 2023 Trafficking in Persons Report (TIP) officially released on 15 June 2023 by US Secretary of State Anthony Blinken, the Philippines was one among the 30 countries given the highest rating for fully meeting the minimum standards for the elimination of trafficking in persons under the US Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000. This is the eighth year in a row that the country has achieved Tier 1 placement since 2016.

During the TIP Report Launch, Ambassadorat-Large Cindy Dyer who leads the US Department of State Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons, cited the Philippines and Indonesia for working together "to assist trafficking victims lured by cybercrime syndicates into cyberscam operations."

The two countries were mentioned for exemplifying strong partnership between countries in addressing the vulnerability of migrants, refugees, and international jobseekers to human traffickers.

"The Tier 1 ranking obtained by the Philippines is indicative of our intensified efforts to combat human trafficking. We thank the US State Department for recognizing our campaign against human traffickers," said Ambassador Jose Manuel Romualdez.

Among the ASEAN member states, only the Philippines and Singapore made it to the Tier 1 list. A total of 188 countries were evaluated for government efforts to fight trafficking undertaken during the period 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023.



CIRCULAR ECONOMY FOR TEXTILES

Taking responsibility to reduce, reuse and recycle textile waste and boosting markets for used textiles

The Commission is proposing rules to make producers responsible for the full lifecycle of textile products and to support the sustainable management of textile waste across the EU. This initiative will accelerate the development of the separate collection, sorting, reuse and recycling sector for textiles in the EU, in line with the EU Strategy for Sustainable and Circular Textiles. Increasing the availability of used textiles is expected to create local jobs and save money for consumers in the EU and beyond, while alleviating the impacts of textile production on natural resources.

The Commission is proposing to introduce mandatory and harmonised Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) schemes for textiles in all EU Member States, where producers will cover the costs of management of textile waste. - EU


FLY INTO THE WIND: How to Harness Faith and **Fearlessness on Your Ascent to Greatness** By LT. COLONEL DAN ROONEY

POPULATION

The nation's median age increased by 0.2 years to 38.9 years between 2021 and 2022, according to Vintage 2022 Population Estimates released on June 22, 2023 by the U.S. Census Bureau. Median age is the age at which half of the population is older and half of the population is younger.

"As the nation's median age creeps closer to 40, you can really see how the aging of baby boomers, and now their children — sometimes called echo boomers — is impacting the median age. The eldest of the echo boomers have started to reach or exceed the nation's median age of 38.9," said Kristie Wilder, a demographer in the Census Bureau's Population Division.

"While natural change nationally has been positive, as there have been more births than deaths, birth rates have gradually declined over the past two decades. Without a rapidly growing young population, the U.S. median age will likely continue its slow but steady rise."

A third (17) of the states in the country had a median age above 40.0 in 2022, led by Maine with the highest at 44.8, and New Hampshire at 43.3. Utah (31.9), the District of Columbia (34.8), and Texas (35.5) had the lowest median ages in the nation.

Hawaii had the largest increase in median age among states, up 0.4 years to 40.7.

However, when reactions of fear continue to be frequent and intense in the absence of a threat or traumatic experience, they may interfere with how you function at work, maintain good personal relationships, and ability to enjoy life. These PTSD reactions can include:

> Recurrent unintentional

thoughts or memories of the trauma.

- Feelings of distress.
- Nightmares.
- Avoidance of things that remind us of trauma.
 - Problems sleeping.

 - Feeling distant from others.
- Negative thoughts and/or mood..

Preventing Lyme Disease

As the weather grows warmer in parts of the country, you may spend more time outside. Being outside can put you at risk for tick bites. Some ticks carry Lyme disease which is spread by the bite of an infected tick.


Lyme disease can produce a wide range of symptoms, including fever, rash, facial paralysis, and arthritis.

Here are steps you and your family can take to prevent tick bites and reduce the risk of contracting Lyme disease.

- · Know where to expect ticks. The ticks most likely to cause Lyme disease live in moist and humid environments, particularly in and near wooded or grassy areas. Try walking in the center of trails and avoid walking through tall bushes or grass.
- · Repel ticks on skin and clothing. Use Environmental Protection

Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellents containing DEET, picaridin, IR3535, oil of lemon eucalyptus, paramenthane-diol, or 2-undecanone.

- · Perform daily tick checks. Check your body for ticks after being outdoors, even in your own yard. Use a hand-held or full-length mirror to view all parts of your body and remove any tick you find.
- · Learn to spot the signs and symptoms of lyme disease. Signs and symptoms include rash, ever, chills, headache, fatigue, muscle and joint aches or swelling, and swollen lymph nodes.
- · Seek medical attention if you observe any of these symptoms and have had a tick bite, live in an area known for Lyme disease, or have recently traveled to an area where Lyme disease occurs. - DHS

For a safe summer, prevention and preparation are key. **BE SAFE IN THE SUN**

While some sunlight is necessary for our bodies to produce vitamin D, too much sun can pose a number of health risks. Protecting your skin from the sun's UV rays is the best way to limit your risk of sunburn and skin cancer.

Limiting sun exposure can be simple:

- Stay in the shade—particularly during midday when UV rays are at their peak.
- Wear a wide-brimmed hat, sunglasses, and a longsleeved shirt.
- Use a broad-spectrum sunscreen with SPF 30 or nigher.

Avoid products labeled "tanning oil," and for the best protection, apply sunscreen generously 30 minutes before going outdoors. Reapply every two hours, especially after swimming or sweating.

WHEN THINGS HEAT UP

High temperatures can be dangerous for everyone. Heatstroke, the most dangerous heat-related illness, may occur if your body temperature rises to 103° F or more. Seek medical help immediately if someone is suffering from heat stroke. Call 911 and move the victim to a cool place. Never force the victim to drink liquids.

The best way to avoid a heat-related illness is to limit time outdoors during hot days.

STAY HYDRATED

Dehydration can happen at any time, but it's more likely in higher temperatures, especially with increased exertion.

Alcoholic, caffeinated, and sugary beverages can actually dehydrate your body further. Plain, carbonated, or flavored water or sports drinks with electrolytes should be your go-to choices when hydrating.

ADVANCE FEE FRAUD



Advance fee frauds ask investors to pay a fee up front – in advance of receiving any proceeds, money, stock, or warrants – in order for the deal to go through.

The advance payment may be described as a fee, tax, commission, or incidental expense that will be repaid later. Some advance fee schemes target investors who already purchased underperforming securities and offer to sell those securities if an "advance fee" is paid, or target investors who have already lost money in investment schemes.

Fraudsters often direct investors to wire advance fees to escrow agents or lawyers to give investors comfort and to lend an air of legitimacy to their schemes. Fraudsters also may try to fool investors with official-sounding websites and e-mail addresses.

Advance fee frauds may involve the sale of products or services, the offering of investments, lottery winnings, found money, or many other so-called opportunities. Fraudsters carrying out advance fee schemes may:

- Offer common financial instruments such as bank guarantees, old government or corporate bonds, medium or long term notes, stand-by letters of credit, blocked funds programs, "fresh cut" or "seasoned" paper, and proofs of funds;
- Offer to find financing arrangements for clients who pay a "finder's fee" in advance; or
- Pose as legitimate U.S. brokers or firms and offer to help investors recover their stock market losses by exchanging worthless stock, but requiring investors to pay an upfront "security deposit" or post an "insurance" or "performance bond." - SEC

Young Americans lead 2023 travel trends with wellness at the forefront

RICHMOND, Va. -- Allianz Partners USA, the travel insurance and assistance company known for popularizing the term "microcation" in 2019 has identified yet another travel trend making waves amongst Americans.


CITY OF LAS VEGAS RESIDENTS INVITED TO JOIN NEW CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY
