Trump wins 2024 New Hampshire primary; Haley vows to continue fight





WASHINGTON — Former President Donald Trump won the New Hampshire Republican primary, CBS News projected, defeating his sole remaining rival, Nikki Haley, in a victory that further cemented his status as the clear front-runner to become the GOP's 2024 presidential nominee.

Trump's win in the Granite State dealt a blow to Haley's efforts to unite an anti-Trump coalition of moderate Republicans and independents capable of slowing his march to the nomination.

Speaking after Trump's victory came into focus, Haley said she would remain in the race, telling supporters that "this race is far from over."

YOUR VOTE COUNTS! All states are required to count every absentee ballot that is valid and reaches local election officials by the absentee ballot receipt deadline.

You must complete a new Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) this year to ensure you receive your ballot for the 2024 elections. Submitting the FPCA allows you to request absentee ballots for all elections for federal offices, including primaries and special elections.

You can complete the FPCA online at FVAP.gov. The online voting assistant will ask you questions specific to your state. The website will also advise ballot request and return deadlines, which are different for each state and territory.

Ash clouds cover Indonesia's Java island towns as Mount Merapi erupts

ISTANBUL – Mount Merapi, Indonesia's most active volcano, began spewing lava on Sunday, January 21, with ash clouds covering some towns on the Java island, a senior official said.

The rocks and lava flows formed by Merapi's eruption spread over a two-kilometer (1.24-mile) area on the slopes of the volcano, the *ABC News* reported, citing Agus Budi Santoso, director of the Indonesian Geological Disaster Technology Research and Development Center.

Santoso said the eruption, which caused no casualties, resulted in the release of hot ash and gas clouds, which covered the sky in some towns.

Earlier, Indonesia's Volcano Scipeopl ence and Geological Disaster Reduction adolu



Center, in a statement, said the Lewotobi Laki-Laki Volcano erupted, spewing ash up to 700 meters high, prompting 6,500 people in the region to seek refuge. - Anadolu

POPE FRANCIS CALLS FOR RELEASE OF NUNS, HOSTAGES KIDNAPPED IN HAITI

VATICAN CITY — Pope Francis on Sunday called for the release of hostages, including six nuns, who were kidnapped on a bus in Haiti on January 20, and said he was praying for social harmony in the country.

Armed gunmen hijacked a bus in Haiti's capital Port-au-Prince with at least six nuns on board and drove off to an unknown destination taking all passengers hostage, *Vatican News* reported on January 21, citing the Haitian Conference of Religious group.

"I have learned with sorrow of the kidnapping, in Haiti, of a group of people, including six religious sisters," Pope Francis said after his weekly Angelus prayer. "In my heartfelt plea for their release, I pray for social concord in the country, and I invite everyone to bring an end to the violence, which is causing a great deal of suffering to that dear population," he added.

Violence has been escalating for months in Haiti as gangs jockey for power and seek to put pressure on interim Prime Minister Ariel Henry, ahead of the Feb. 7 expiry of a political accord that consolidated his power.

UK bids to reduce number of migrants arriving legally

LONDON – Britain's home secretary reiterated the government's policy to reduce the number of migrants arriving by legal routes as well as to stop asylum seekers arriving across the English Channel in small boats.

Responding to lawmakers' questions in parliament, James Cleverly said 92,000 legacy asylum claims were cleared last year and more than 112,000 claims were processed, marking the "largest volume in two decades."

Saying that total asylum backlog is decreasing, he noted that they will continue to review and improve processes to accelerate the decision making in this regard.

Asked what steps were being taken to reduce the number of legal migrants coming to the UK, Cleverly cited recent government measures to further reduce legal net migration, including limitations on family dependents being brought in by workers and students.

He also vowed to raise the minimum income requirement progressively over the next few years.

"We want to make sure that this country is able to benefit from the expertise, knowledge and work of the brightest and best from around the whole world in a manner which is controlled, which is fair, which is predictable and which is well enforced," he said.

Nearly 30,000 migrants crossed the English Channel last year, over a third less than in 2022, when over 45,000 made the crossing. - *Anadolu*

Israel defends itself at the UN's top court against Gaza genocide allegations

THE HAGUE, NETHERLANDS — Accused of committing genocide against Palestinians, Israel on January 12 insisted at the United Nations' highest court that its war in Gaza was a legitimate defense of its people and that it was Hamas militants who were guilty of genocide.

Israel described the allegations leveled by South Africa as hypocritical and said one of the biggest cases ever to come before an international court reflected a world turned upside down. Israeli leaders defend their air and ground offensive in Gaza as a legitimate response to Hamas' October 7 attack, when militants stormed through Israeli communities, killing some 1,200 people and taking around 250 hostages.

Israeli legal advisor Tal Becker told a packed auditorium at the ornate Palace of Peace in The Hague that the country is fighting a "war it did not start and did not want."

In the afternoon, of January 12, Germany said it wants to intervene in the proceedings on Israel's behalf, saying there was "no basis whatsoever" for an accusation of genocide against Israel.

Germany soon to recruit skilled Filipino workers

MANILA – Germany expressed interest in hiring skilled workers from the Philippines after the official visit of German Foreign Minister Annalena Baerbock to Manila recently, the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW) said

DMW Undersecretary Patricia Yvonne Caunan said Germany and the Philippines recently signed a "joint declaration of interest" on the recruitment of overseas Filipino workers, which spells out that Manila wants a "win-win situation" where recruitment is sustainable.- PNA

More than 13,000 people killed in Sudan conflict: UN

KHARTOUM, Sudan – More than 13,000 people have been killed and 26,000 others injured in the conflict in Sudan since last year, the United Nations humanitarian office said.

Sudan has been mired by fighting between the army, led by Gen. Abdel Fattah al-Burhan, head of the country's ruling Sovereign Council, and the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) paramilitary group since April 2023.- *Anadolu*

Dozens buried in landsilide in southwestern China

ANKARA – Rescuers dug through debris after dozens of villagers were buried in a landslide that struck China's southwestern Yunnan province early Monday, January 22, state media reported.

At least 47 people were buried when a landslide struck Liangshui village in the city of Zhaotong at 5:51 a.m. local time, according to Xinhua News Agency. It said that Chinese President Xi Jinping has directed "all-out search and rescue" of the people missing in the landslide.- *Anadolu*

Texas continues its work to secure the border

Governor Greg Abbott, the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS), and the Texas National Guard continue to work together to secure the border; stop the smuggling of drugs, weapons, and people into Texas; and prevent, detect, and interdict transnational criminal activity between ports of entry.

Since the launch of Operation Lone Star, the multi-agency effort has led to over 495,400 illegal immigrant apprehensions and more than 38,300 criminal arrests, with more than 34,700 felony charges. In the fight against the fentanyl crisis, Texas law enforcement has seized over 453 million lethal doses of fentanyl during this border mission.

Talks for an Elusive Peace in Ukraine Held in Davos

National security advisers from 83 countries gathered in the Swiss town of Davos on January 14, on the eve of the World Economic Forum, to discuss Ukraine's 10-point peace plan that outlines Kyiv's terms for ending the war with Russia.

This is the fourth such gathering organized by Ukraine around President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's plan, which calls for Russia's complete withdrawal from all Ukrainian territories.

The 83 delegations, including 18 from Asia and 12 from Africa, participated at the meeting, a significantly larger number than the 65 that attended the last round of talks in Malta last October. Two previous meetings were held, one in Copenhagen and another one in Jeddah.

National security representatives from emerging economies such as Brazil, India, Saudi Arabia and South Africa took part in the talks. These countries, along with China and Russia, are part of the BRICS alliance.

Swiss Foreign Affairs Minister Ignazio Cassis, who is cohosting the talks at Davos, hailed the participants, adding they could play an important role in the talks.

"The participation of the BRICS alliance is very important

because these countries have a relationship to Russia. All this can create this collective movement to bring in countries that are far from the conflict but can play a role in influencing China and Russia," Cassis said. - VOA

NASA shares progress toward early Artemis moon missions with crew

WASHINGTON -- NASA announced updates to its Artemis campaign that will establish the foundation for long-term scientific exploration at the Moon, land the first woman and first person of color on the lunar surface, and prepare for human expeditions to Mars for the benefit of all. To safely carry out these missions, agency leaders are adjusting the schedules for Artemis II and Artemis III to allow teams to work through challenges associated with first-time developments, operations, and integration.

NASA will now target September 2025 for Artemis II, the first crewed Artemis mission around the Moon, and September 2026 for Artemis III, which is planned to land the first astronauts near the lunar South Pole. Artemis IV, the first mission to the Gateway lunar space station, remains on track for 2028

Rozhen's new robotic telescope allows astronomers to observe remotely

SOFIA, Bulgaria – At the beginning of February, the Rozhen National Astronomical Observatory (NAO) will start a scientific observation programme using its new robotic telescope, NAO Director Nikola Petrov told BTA.

Astronomers from Hungary, Germany, France, Poland, Serbia, Italy, India, Japan, Russia and the United States have collaborated with their Bulgarian colleagues at Rozhen before, but now the new 1.5 m aperture telescope will allow them to carry out observations remotely.

The NAO astronomers are finishing trial observations with the new telescope, which was inaugurated in July 2023.

The tests show that the device performs no worse than the 2 m aperture telescope at Rozhen, Petrov said.

The AZ 1500 telescope was supplied under a project financed through the National Research Infrastructure Roadmap 2020-2027, coordinated by the Ministry of Education and Science.

It was manufactured by Austrian company ASA Astrosyseme GmbH.

With its latest-generation technology, the device has enabled the observatory in the Rhodope Mountains (Southern Bulgaria) to retain its status as a leading astronomical complex of Southeastern Europe, Petrov said.

The new telescope will be used mainly for photometric

It will capture objects in the visible light spectrum. After additional instruments are installed, it will be used for spectral observations as well.

With the new device at their disposal, the Rozhen astronomers will continue to observe both Solar System objects (asteroids, comets etc.) and galaxy-level objects. (BTA)

The exchange is fully funded and U.S. Embassy Sweden will assist the selected participant with travel and visa application. The visa application requires a visa interview in Stockholm in person.

US, Switzerland sign Pharmaceutical Good Manufacturing Practice Agreement

On January 12, the United States and Switzerland signed the U.S.-Switzerland Pharmaceutical Good Manufacturing Practice (GMP) Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA). Deputy United States Trade Representative Jayme White, FDA Deputy Commissioner for Policy, Legislation, and International Affairs Andi Fristedt, State Secretary for the State Secretariat for Economic Affairs Helene Budliger Artieda, and Swissmedic Head of Management Services and International Affairs Dr. Jörg Schläpfer took part in the signing ceremony.

"This MRA will help streamline the movement of pharmaceutical goods and is a step in the right direction to create a safer, stronger, more reliable supply chain that minimizes drug shortages," said Ambassador Jayme White.

This agreement allows U.S. and Swiss authorities to share documents from their routine GMP



inspections of pharmaceutical manufacturing facilities, which will reduce unnecessary costs and duplicative efforts. This will allow the two authorities to better exercise their respective regulatory discretion to re-allocate resources to where they are most needed, thereby ensuring that all drugs imported into the two countries are as safe as possible.



The UN Security Council met on January 12 for briefings on the worsening situation across the Middle East, looking first at threats of forced displacement from Gaza and then the escalating conflict in and around the Red Sea – all as the war in Gaza approaches the 100-day mark.

The UN relief chief told ambassadors that any Gazans forced to flee the enclave must be allowed to return "as international law demands", while a senior political affairs official warned that the cycle of violence over Red Sea shipping lanes risked major repercussions in Yemen and the wider region. - UN News

Cabo Verde is the third country to be certified in the WHO African region.





DFA says PH adheres to One China Policy following Taiwan polls

MANILA – The Philippines is committed to the One China Policy, the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) said following the victory of Taiwan's ruling democratic party candidate William Lai Ching-te in a recently concluded presidential election.

"The Department of Foreign Affairs reaffirms the principles contained in the Joint Communique of the Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Government of the People's Republic of China signed by President Ferdinand E. Marcos and Premier Zhou Enlai on 9 June 1975," DFA spokesperson Ma. Teresita Daza said in a statement.

Under the One China principle, the Philippines recognizes the People's Republic of China as the sole Chinese government.

President-elect Lai served as chairman of the Democratic Progressive Party and was President Tsai Ing-wen's vice president. - PNA

The EU welcomes the adoption of the United Nations Security Council resolution 2722 of 10 January that is strongly condemning Houthi attacks on Red Sea shipping.







These are all lies they tell you to create a sense of urgency. They want you to scan the QR code and open the URL without thinking about it.

A scammer's QR code could take you to a spoofed site that looks real but isn't. And if you log in to the spoofed site, the scammers could steal any information you enter. Or the QR code could install malware that steals your information

before you realize it.

So how can you protect yourself?

• If you see a QR code in an unexpected place, inspect the URL before you open it. If it looks like a URL you recognize, make sure it's not spoofed — look for misspellings or a switched letter.

 Don't scan a QR code in an email or text message you weren't expecting

 especially if it urges you to act immediately. If you think the message is legitimate, use a phone number or website you know is real to contact the company.

Protect your phone and accounts.
 Update your phone's OS to protect against hackers and protect your online accounts with strong passwords and multi-factor authentication.

IRS Free File service available for millions of taxpayers

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service announced that IRS Free File Guided Tax Software service is ready for taxpayers to use in advance of the opening of tax season later this month.

Marking its 22nd filing season, IRS Free File went live today, more than two weeks before the 2024 filing season start date. The IRS starts accepting and processing individual tax returns on Jan. 29.

Millions of taxpayers across the nation can access free software products provided by IRS Free File trusted partners by visiting IRS.gov.

Beware of IRS impersonation telephone scams

A sophisticated phone scam targeting taxpayers, including recent immigrants, has been making the rounds throughout the country. Callers make aggressive calls posing as IRS agents, using fake names and bogus IRS identification badge numbers in hopes of stealing taxpayer money or personal information. They may know a lot about their targets, and they usually alter the caller ID to make it look like the IRS is calling.

Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly through a gift card or wire transfer. Victims may be threatened with arrest, de-

portation or suspension of a business or driver's license. In many cases, the caller becomes hostile and insulting. Victims may be told they have a refund due to try to trick them into sharing private information. If the phone isn't answered, the scammers often leave an "urgent" callback request.

Decreasing calories without depriving the body of essential vitamins and minerals, known as calorie restriction, has long been known to delay the progression of age-related diseases in animal models.


