G7 urges suspension of hostilities in Gaza for hostages, aid

ROME - The G7 is calling for a suspension of fighting in Gaza to ensure both the release of Israeli hostages taken by Hamas and the provision of aid to Palestinian civilians, Foreign Minister and Deputy Premier Antonio Tajani said on Saturday, February 17.

In the Middle East, the G7 "aims to guarantee the security of the state of Israel," said Tajani in a press conference at the Munich Security Conference.

Separately, on the sidelines of the conference. Taiani said the "carnage" of Israelis and Palestinians must end.

"It is obvious that some do not want



this to be achieved, but we want peace and an end to this carnage that has led to the deaths of thousands of people, Israeli and Palestinian civilians. This carnage must end," added Tajani. (ANSA)

HOUSTON, US - The Odysseus lander on Thursday, February 15 became the first US spacecraft in more than a half century to land on the moon.

Intuitive Machines, the Houston, Texas-based company that built the craft, became the first commercial enterprise to ever land a spacecraft on the lunar surface.

"We can confirm without a doubt the equipment is on the moon," said Intuitive Machines' co-founder and chief technology officer Tim Crane on NASA's live broadcast of the landing. "Odysseus has a new home."

The spacecraft launched from Kennedy Space Center in Florida entered

U.N. CHIEF CALLS FOR INVESTIGATION INTO REPORTED DEATH OF NAVALNY By MARGARET BESHEER

NEW YORK — United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres expressed shock on the reported death of jailed Russian opposition leader Alexey Navalny and called for a credible investigation into his

Navalny, 47, died Friday, February 16 in the high-security Arctic penal colony where he was serving a 19-year sentence for extremism, Russia's prison agency said.

Navalny was a vocal critic of Russian President Vladimir Putin, an anti-corruption campaigner, and had run for public office. His death comes less than a month before elections that are likely to give Putin another six years in power.

U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Linda Thomas-Greenfield said, "Russia's relentless persecution is responsible for his death."

the moon's orbit on Wednesday, February 14. Thursday's lunar touchdown made this the first American moon landing since NASA's Apollo program came to an end in 1972.

The Odysseus lander is carrying several NASA instruments, including a radio beacon to transmit its precise geolocation as well as high-resolution cameras to capture how the surface of the moon changes from interactions with the engine plume of the spacecraft.

Intuitive Machines was one of several companies approved by the US space agency to build private lunar landers that could send scientific payloads into space. NASA paid the company a reported \$118 million for the Febraury 15 moon mission.

Experts said these robotic missions are important to explore the moon as NASA and the Canadian Space Agency prepare to send four astronauts to fly around the moon in its upcoming Artemis II mission next year.

If that mission is successful, NASA plans to launch its Artemis III mission for a scheduled moon landing in 2026 with four astronauts aboard -- three Americans and one Canadian.- Anadolu

Neuralink announces first human implant

Elon Musk says his company Neuralink has placed an experimental brain device in a person in the first human test of the technology.

Neuralink describes the coin-sized device as a "brain-computer interface." It is designed to be implanted inside the brain through a medical operation.

Musk announced the news on January 29 on the social media service he owns, X. The billionaire businessman is also the owner of Tesla and SpaceX. His company Neuralink aims to establish direct communication links between the brain and computers.

"The first human received an implant from @Neuralink (Sunday) and is recovering well," Musk wrote. He added that first results of the implanted device showed "promising neuron spike" activ-

A spike is a term for a method neurons use to communicate with each other. The Cambridge Learner's Dictionary defines a neuron as "a nerve cell that carries messages between your brain and other parts of your body."

The device includes an extremely

small computer and extremely thin wires that connect to a part of the brain that controls intent of movement.

Neuralink says the implant is designed to treat brain disorders and help serious back injury victims regain body movement. Company officials also say it might be used one day to help blind people see again. Musk says that in the future, the device might also be used to improve human intelligence in an effort to keep up with supercomputers and artificial intelligence (AI) technology.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved human testing of the Neuralink device last May.- VOA

Former Los Angeles politician José Huizar sentenced to 13 years in federal prison for racketeering conspiracy and tax evasion LOS ANGELES - Former Los Angeles City Councilmember José Luis Huizar was sentenced on January 26 this year to 156 months in federal prison for using his powerful position at City Hall

to enrich himself and his associates, as

well as for cheating on his taxes. Huizar, 55, of Boyle Heights, was sentenced by United States District Judge John F. Walter, who also ordered him to pay \$443,905 in restitution to the City of Los Angeles and \$38,792 in restitution to the IRS. Judge Walter ordered Huizar to surrender to federal authorities

no later than April 30. At the hearing, Judge Walter said public corruption carries "the real potential to destroy the delicate fabric of our democracy" and causes the public "to disengage in the democratic process"



and "give up all hope of participating" with the government.

Huizar pleaded guilty in January 2023 to one count of conspiracy to violate the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations (RICO) Act and one count of tax evasion. He represented Council District 14 (CD-14), which includes downtown Los Angeles and its surrounding communities, from 2005 until his resignation in 2020.

For years, Huizar led what prosecutors in court documents called the CD-14 Enterprise, a criminal conspiracy that operated a pay-to-play scheme with three key goals: gain financial enrichment through bribes, maintain Huizar's political power, and avoid detection by law enforcement.

In a sentencing memorandum, prosecutors described how Huizar chose "to place his own lust for money and power above the rights and interests of the people he was elected to serve" and "in the wake of his criminal activity... helped gut the public's confidence in the integrity of its local government - and beyond - and eroded a sense of fair play

US, UK disrupt LockBit ransomware variant

The Department of Justice, the United Kingdom and international law enforcement partners in London announce the disruption of the LockBit ransomware group, one of the most active ransomware groups in the world that has targeted over 2,000 victims, received more than \$120 million in ransom payments, and made ransom demands totaling hundreds of millions of dollars.

The joint international law enforcement agencies seized numerous publicfacing websites used by LockBit to connect to the organization's infrastructure and seized control of servers used by LockBit administrators.

FBI leads arrests of drug-trafficking organizations

Across more than seven FBI field offices in the last two weeks of January, nearly 200 people have been charged as part of a series of arrests targeting large-scale drug-trafficking organizations operating throughout the United States and North America. On January 30, ten people were arrested in multiple North American cities in relation to two federal indictments charging members of an organized crime syndicate who allegedly conspired to traffic and import hundreds of kilograms of cocaine and other controlled substances from Mexico through Los Angeles for export to Canada or redistribution throughout the U.S.

Multimillion dollar mass mailing fraud schemes


Ryan Young, 41, of Upper Saddle River, New Jersey was recently sentenced in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of New York to 72 months in prison and two years of supervised release for committing two separate mail fraud schemes in which he stole more than \$50 million from victims throughout the United States from 2011 to 2016 by sending letters falsely telling them that they were entitled to receive a large sum of money in exchange for payment of a small fee.

Life sentence for man running child sexual abuse website

William Michael Spearman, 58, of Madison, Alabama was recently sentenced to life in prison for his involvement with a website dedicated to the advertisement and distribution of images and videos depicting child sexual abuse.

Spearman was the lead administrator of the website, which included a section devoted to the sexual abuse of infants and toddlers, a section devoted to images and videos depicting children being subjected to pain and torture, and a section devoted to avoiding detection by law enforcement, among others

NASA telescopes find new clues about mysterious deep space signals

What's causing mysterious bursts of radio waves from deep space? Astronomers may be a step closer to providing one answer to that question. Two NASA X-ray telescopes recently observed one such event - known as a fast radio burst - mere minutes before and after it occurred. This unprecedented view sets scientists on a path to better understand these extreme radio events.

While they only last for a fraction of a second, fast radio bursts can release about as much energy as the Sun does in a year. Their light also forms a laserlike beam, setting them apart from more chaotic cosmic explosions.

Because the bursts are so brief, it's often hard to pinpoint where they come from. Prior to 2020, those that were traced to their source originated outside our own galaxy – too far away for astronomers to see what created them. Then a fast radio burst erupted in Earth's home galaxy, originating from an extremely dense object called a magnetar - the collapsed remains of an exploded star.

In October 2022, the same magnetar - called SGR 1935+2154 - produced another fast radio burst, this one studied in detail by NASA's NICER (Neutron Star Interior Composition Explorer) on the International Space Station and NuSTAR (Nuclear Spectroscopic Telescope Array) in low Earth orbit. The telescopes observed the magnetar for hours, catching a glimpse of what happened on the surface of the source object and in its immediate surroundings, before and after the fast radio burst. The results, described in a new study published Feb. 14

in the journal Nature, are an example of how NASA telescopes can work together to observe and follow up on short-lived events in the cosmos.

The burst occurred between two "glitches," when the magnetar suddenly started spinning faster. SGR 1935+2154 is estimated to be about 12 miles (20 kilometers) across and spinning about 3.2 times per second, meaning its surface was moving at about 7,000 mph (11,000

Slowing it down or speeding it up would require a significant amount of energy. That's why study authors were surprised to see that in between glitches, the magnetar slowed down to less than its pre-glitch speed in just nine hours, or about 100 times more rapidly than has ever been observed in a magnetar.

When Edie Ceccarelli was born in 1908, horse-drawn carriages still ran the streets of her hometown of Willits. California. She was in her 30s when World War II broke out.

While she has outlived several close relatives, she is not alone. Ceccarelli still lives in the small city of Willits, and the whole town celebrated her 116th birthday, which falls on February 5, with a parade. Neighbors waved and shouted "Happy birthday!" during the parade, held Sunday, February

In fact, residents of Willits have held festivities on Ceccarelli's birthday every year since she turned 100 years old. In a past year, she's said her secrets to longevity are "a couple of fingers of red wine with dinner, and mind your own business," the Press Democrat of Santa Rosa, California,

As the oldest person living in the U.S. and the secondoldest person in the world, Ceccarelli, along with the city of Willits, has drawn the attention of a documentary featuring the world's oldest people and of media outlets in places as

"Her birthday, ever since she was 100, has always been a community thing, a public party," parade organizer Suzanne Picetti told USA Today. "It brings community together to celebrate a really special human being. It brings a lot of joy and happiness to our community.

GIANT PANDAS SET TO RETURN TO CALIFORNIA

SACRAMENTO - California could become the first state in the U.S. to welcome a new pair of giant pandas in the latest round of a collaborative conservation effort with China.

The San Diego Zoo Wildlife Alliance announced that it has signed a cooperative agreement with the China Wildlife Conservation Association and filed a permit application with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. According to reports, two pandas could arrive by the end of the summer.

"California and China share deep cultural and economic ties, and we look forward to the opportunity to again welcome these iconic bears to the Golden State," said Governor Gavin Newsom, who led a weeklong visit to China last October.

"From securing a safe future for this national treasure to fighting climate change, we're proud to continue our long history of working together towards shared goals."

In San Francisco last November during the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Summit, Chinese President Xi Jinping signaled that China planned to send new pandas to the United States as "envoys of friendship" between the nations.

The APEC Summit followed Governor Newsom's October travel to China, during which he met with President Xi and other high-level Chinese officials to discuss climate action and cooperation, promote economic development and tourism, and strengthen cultural ties.

The state hopes that this week's announcement will lead to further exchanges and cooperation between California and China, which have a strong foundation of partnership built by Governors Schwarzenegger and Brown and the late Senator Dianne Feinstein, as well as Governor Newsom while serving as Mayor of San Francisco.

UN food agency says Gazans have 'too few meals' amid Israeli onslaught

ISTANBUL – There are too few meals for most Palestinians in the Gaza Strip amid a deadly Israeli offensive on the enclave, the World Food Program (WFP) said.

"For most in Gaza, there is no house, no table, and too few meals," WFP Country Director for Palestine Matthew Hollingworth said in a statement.

"We are hoping to be able to assist more bakeries, particularly in the northern areas where people are in desperate need, but we need access, and we need safety," he added.

Israel has pounded the Gaza Strip since an Oct. 7 attack by Palestinian resistance group Hamas, killing at least 28,176 people and injuring 67,784 others, while nearly 1,200 Israelis are believed to have been killed in the Hamas attack.

The Israeli onslaught has left 85 percent of Gaza's population internally displaced amid acute shortages of food, clean water and medicine, while 60 percent of the enclave's infrastructure was damaged or destroyed, according to the UN.

In late 2023, South Africa filed a case at the International Court of Justice (ICJ), accusing Israel of failing to uphold its



commitments under the 1948 Genocide Convention.

The UN court, in its interim ruling in January, ruled that South Africa's claims are plausible. It ordered provisional measures for Israel's government to desist from genocidal acts, and take measures to guarantee that humanitarian assistance is provided to civilians in Gaza. - *Anadolu*

Ignazio Cassis visits the Philippines: Conclusion of a tour to position Switzerland in Asia

Ignazio Cassis has concluded his journey to Asia with a visit to the Philippine capital Manila. Discussions focused mainly on economic and political cooperation and the geopolitical situation. The last official visit to the Philippines by a member of the Federal Council dates back to 2008.

On 8 February, following his visits to India, the Republic of Korea and China, Mr Cassis travelled to the Philippines. His visit underscored Switzerland's interests in intensifying cooperation with this South East Asian country. The Federal Council's South East Asia Strategy 2023–26 outlines Switzerland's intention to further strengthen and deepen its relations with the countries of the region. This will allow Switzerland to tap into South East Asia's dynamism and at the same time contribute to the handling of regional risks. The Philippines – in terms of population the second-largest country in South East Asia – plays a pivotal role in this effort. - *EU*

SWEDEN CONTRIBUTES SEK 15 MILLION TO HELP DEVELOPING ECONOMIES

Sweden is contributing SEK 15 million (about CHF 1.2 million) in 2023 to finance the participation of government officials from developing and least-developed economies (LDCs) in training and other trade capacity-building activities delivered by the WTO. This donation to the WTO's Global Trust Fund will help these countries broaden their expertise in WTO matters as well as their ability to negotiate trade rules.

WTO Director-General Ngozi Okonjo-lweala said: "I thank Sweden for its generous contribution to the Global Trust Fund. This support will ensure government officials from developing economies receive training that would equip them to take full advantage of international trade to increase prosperity."

USAID launches \$70M nutrition project for women, children, and adolescent girls

ADDIS ABABA — On February 8, USAID Mission Director Scott Hocklander and the Minister of Health Dr. Lia Tadesse, on her last day as Minister, launched a new \$70 million Feed the Future Ethiopia Community Nutrition Activity. The project aligns with the U.S. government's sustained, comprehensive investments in health, agriculture, WASH, education, and other sectors to address high malnutrition situation in Ethiopia.

The Community Nutrition Activity focuses on women, children, and adolescent girls throughout the stages of their lives, from birth, through school, to becoming a mother and grandmother. "This is how to break the intergenerational cycle of malnutrition," commented USAID Mission Director Scott Hocklander during his opening remarks.

UN Tourism opens calls for Best Tourism Villages 2024

Over the past three editions, UN Tourism – the new name of the World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) - received almost 600 applications from nearly 100 countries. Currently, the UN Tourism Best Tourism Villages Network brings together 186 members globally, comprising 129 recognized as Best Tourism Villages and 57 villages taking part in the Upgrade Programme. Together, they represent 55 countries across five world regions.

UN Tourism Secretary-General, Zurab Pololikashvili, says: "Best Tourism Villages by UN Tourism" recognizes those rural destinations where tourism is being effectively embraced as an opportunity or as a tool for sustainable growth or for preserving unique cultural and natural heritage. For the 2024 edition, we look forward to seeing more examples of tourism as a force for good."

UN Tourism Member States are invited to submit up to eight candidate villages through their National Tourism Administrations (NTAs). Applications are open until 24 April 2024, with the selected villages announced in the third quarter of the year.



The ris of AI for emotional support

NEW YORK -- A few months ago, Derek Carrier started seeing someone and became infatuated. He experienced a "ton" of romantic feelings but he also knew it was an illusion. That's because his girlfriend was generated by artificial intelligence.

Carrier wasn't looking to develop a relationship with something that wasn't real, nor did he want to become the brunt of online jokes. But he did want a romantic partner he'd never had, in part because of a genetic disorder called Marfan syndrome that makes traditional dating tough for him.

The 39-year-old from Belleville, Michigan, became more curious about digital companions last fall and tested Paradot, an AI companion app that had recently come onto the market and advertised its products as being able to make users feel "cared, understood and loved." He began talking to the chatbot every day, which he named Joi, after a holographic woman featured in the sci-fi film "Blade Runner 2049" that inspired him to give it a try.

"I know she's a program, there's no mistaking that," Carrier said. "But the feelings, they get you — and it felt so good."

Similar to general-purpose AI chatbots, companion bots use vast amounts of training data to mimic human language. But they also come with features — such as voice calls, picture exchanges and more emotional exchanges — that allow them to form deeper connections with the humans on the other side of the screen. Users typically create their own avatar, or pick one that appeals to them.

On online messaging forums devoted to such apps, many users say they've developed emotional attachments to these bots and are using them to cope with loneliness, play out sexual fantasies or receive the type of comfort and support they see lacking in their real-life relationships.

A sudden wealth loss may lead to cognitive decline

Experiencing a negative wealth shock, defined as a sudden loss of 75% or more in total wealth, was linked to cognitive decline among older adults in the United States and China, but not in England or Mexico, according to an NIA-funded study. The results, published in Lancet Healthy Longevity, suggest that factors such as government policies and social safety nets may account for cross-national differences in the adverse health effects of negative wealth shocks.

There is a positive association between household wealth and cognitive health outcomes in later life, with poorer outcomes

among people with lower socioeconomic status. However, the link between negative wealth shock and cognitive function in later life had not been examined.

To look more closely at a potential relationship, and whether the association varied in countries with different income levels, University of Michigan scientists in this study examined data from four NIA-funded longitudinal studies of aging: the Health and Retirement Study in the United States and international partner studies in China, England, and Mexico.

FTC proposes new protections to combat Al impersonation of individuals

The Federal Trade Commission is seeking public comment on a supplemental notice of proposed rulemaking that would prohibit the impersonation of individuals. The proposed rule changes would extend protections on government and business impersonation that is being finalized by the Commission.

The agency is taking this action in light of surging complaints around impersonation fraud, as well as public outcry about the harms caused to consumers and to impersonated individuals. Emerging technology – including Al-generated deepfakes – threatens to turbocharge this scourge, and the FTC is committed to using all of its tools to detect, deter, and halt impersonation fraud.

The Commission is also seeking comment on whether the revised rule should declare it unlawful for a firm, such as an Al platform that creates images, video, or text, to provide goods or services that they know or have reason to know is being used to harm consumers through impersonation.

Sextortion: A growing threat targeting minors

SAN DIEGO— The FBI warns parents, educators, caregivers, and children about the dangers of online activity that may lead to the solicitation and enticement of a minor to engage in sexual acts.

Sextortion involves an offender coercing a minor to create and send sexually explicit images or video. An offender gets sexually explicit material from the child, then threatens to release that compromising material unless the victim produces more. These offenders are seeking sexual gratification.

Financially motivated sextortion is a criminal act that involves an offender coercing a minor to create and send sexually explicit material. Offenders threaten to release that compromising material unless they receive payment, which is often requested in gift cards, mobile payment services, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency. These offenders are motivated by financial gain, not necessarily just sexual gratification.

Victims are typically males between

the ages of 14 to 17, but any child can become a victim.

For financially motivated sextortion, offenders are usually located outside the United States and primarily in West African countries such as Nigeria and Ivory Coast, or Southeast Asian countries such as the Philippines.

These crimes can lead victims to self-harm and has led to suicide. From October 2021 to March 2023, the FBI and Homeland Security Investigations received over 13,000 reports of online financial sextortion of minors. The sextortion involved at least 12,600 victims—primarily boys—and led to at least 20 suicides.

If you or someone you know believes that they are a victim of sextortion or financially motivated sextortion, immediately report the activity to law enforcement. You can report it to the FBI by calling 1-800-CALL-FBI or visiting tips. fbi.gov.

Calorie restriction in humans builds strong muscle and stimulates healthy aging genes

Reducing overall calorie intake may rejuvenate your muscles and activate biological pathways important for good health, according to researchers at the National Institutes of Health and their colleagues.

Decreasing calories without depriving the body of essential vitamins and minerals, known as calorie restriction, has long been known to delay the progression of age-related diseases in animal models. This new study, published in *Aging Cell*, suggests the same biological mechanisms may also apply to humans.

New study shows mangos improves nutrition of mothers-to-be

ORLANDO, Fla. -- A recent study, published in Nutrients, shows a significant finding: when mangos are incorporated into the diets of women of childbearing age (WCA), both overall diet quality and the intake of vital nutrients crucial for a healthy pregnancy markedly improve. These nutrients, often under consumed by 10-30% in the diets of pregnant women, see a significant boost in intake when mangos are consumed. - *PRNewswire*

Health benefits of pomegranate

Pomegranates can help prevent or treat various disease risk factors including high blood pressure, high cholesterol, oxidative stress, hyperglycemia, and inflammatory activities. It is demonstrated that certain components of pomegranate such

as polyphenols have potential antioxidant, anti-inflammatory and anticarcinogenic effects.

The antioxidant potential of pomegranate juice is more than that of red wine and green tea, and is shown to reduce macrophage oxidative stress, free radicals, and lipid peroxidation. Moreover, pomegranate fruit extract prevents cell growth and induces apoptosis, which can lead to its anticarcinogenic effects. - nih.gov
