ISRAEL-GAZA WAR PROTESTS SPREAD ACROSS U.S. UNIVERSITIES

What began last week at Columbia University, where (April 25) morning. students refused to end their protests against Israel's war in Gaza despite pushback from the New York school and arrests by police, has spread across the country. Students at various college campuses are staging similar demonstrations that are also being met with police response.

In one of the latest incidents, on Thursday, April 25, police responded as student protesters at Princeton University in New Jersey began setting up an encampment, according to media reports.

In Massachusetts, police forcibly removed an encampment set up by students at Emerson College in Boston and arrested more than 100 people, according to media and police reports.

Students at Harvard University, Tufts University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology set up similar encamp-

Meanwhile, Atlanta police and Georgia state troopers removed a camp on Emory University's quadrangle on Thursday

in Washington on Thursday, hundreds of demonstrators gathered at George Washington University to call for universities to divest from companies linked to Israel and to drop disciplinary charges against pro-Palestinian student protesters. The protest was organized by students from George Washington, Georgetown University and others in the region.

Last week, tensions escalated on Columbia's Manhattan campus when city police arrested more than 100 pro-Palestinian protesters.

In New Haven, Connecticut, on April 22, police arrested 48 protesters, four of whom were not students, at Yale University after they refused to leave an encampment on a plaza at the center of campus.

Two days later at the University of Texas at Austin, hundreds of protesters were met with university officers as Texas state troopers responded in riot gear. Dozens of students who did not leave the area were arrested.

On Wednesday (April 24) police peacefully arrested stu-

dent protesters at the University of Southern California.

A day later, USC announced it would cancel its main graduation ceremony, scheduled for May 10. The university had already canceled a commencement speech by the school's pro-Palestinian valedictorian, citing safety concerns. Source: VOA with some reports from AP & AFP

Hamas says it received Israel's response to its cease-fire proposal

CAIRO — Hamas said it had received on Saturday, April 26, Israel's official response to its latest cease-fire proposal and will study it before submitting its reply, the group's deputy Gaza chief said in a statement.

"Hamas has received today the official response of the Zionist occupation to the proposal presented to the Egyptian and the Qatari mediators on April 13," Khalil Al-Hayya, who is currently based in Qatar, said in a statement published by the group.

After more than six months of war

with Israel in Gaza, the negotiations remain deadlocked, with Hamas sticking to its demands that any agreement must end the war.

An Egyptian delegation visited Israel for discussion with Israeli officials Friday, looking for a way to restart talks to end the conflict and return remaining hostages taken when Hamas fighters stormed into Israeli towns on October 7, an official briefed on the meetings said.

The official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said Israel had no new proposals to make, although it was willing

to consider a limited truce in which 33 hostages would be released by Hamas, instead of the 40 previously under discussion.

On Thursday, the United States and 17 other countries appealed to Hamas to release all of its hostages as a pathway to end the crisis.

Hamas has vowed not to relent to international pressure, but in a statement it issued Friday, it said it was "open to any ideas or proposals that take into account the needs and rights of our people." - VOA/Reuters

US. Chinese defense chiefs hold 1st talks since 2022

WASHINGTON - US Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin spoke via video teleconference on April 16 with his Chinese counterpart Dong Jun in their first engagement in more than a year, the Pentagon said.

They discussed bilateral relations as well as regional and global security issues, Pentagon Press Secretary Maj. Gen. Pat Ryder said.

According to Ryder, Austin reiterated that the US remains committed to its One China Policy, which is guided by the Three Joint Communiques, the Taiwan Relations Act, and the Six Assurances. He also discussed the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war as well as concerns about North Korea, Ryder added.

US House passes \$95-B aid to Ukraine, Israel, Taiwan; threatens TikTok

WASHINGTON - The US House of Representatives on April 20 passed a USD95 billion aid package for Ukraine. Israel, and other US allies overseas.

House Speaker Mike Johnson unveiled a plan to hold votes on four separate foreign aid bills, to later come together into a package, a move that has angered some far-right House Republicans.

Besides aid for Ukraine, Israel, and Taiwan, the fourth bill includes other national security priorities, including a possible TikTok ban, a provision to help pay for aid by using seized Russian assets, and sanctions and otner measures to confront Russia, China and Iran.- Anadolu

N. Korea says it will carry on its space monitoring duty

North Korea says it will carry on its "important duty," as planned, to monitor the military maneuvers of the United States and other hostile forces to enhance its space reconnaissance capabilities, North Korea's National Aerospace Technology Administration, which is responsible for launching military reconnaissance satellites, said in a statement.

Countries concerned are on heightened alert as the North is believed to be preparing for another military spy satellite launch in the near future. North Korea revealed plans to launch three more military spy satellites this year, following what it calls a successful launch of its first military satellite, the Malligyong-1, last November.- NHK

UN welcomes creation of transition council in Haiti

UN Secretary-General António Guterres has welcomed the establishment of a transitional council in Haiti tasked with choosing new political leadership and setting up elections in the crisis-torn Carribean country, the UN spokesman

"He urges all Haitian stakeholders to continue making progress in putting in place transitional governance arrangements, including the timely appointment of an interim Prime Minister and government, and the nomination of the members of the Provisional Electoral Council," said the statement.

Pope Francis appeals for de-escalation of tension in Middle East

ISTANBUL - Pope Francis on Sunday said he is watching the developments in the Middle East with concern


"I make a heartfelt appeal to halt any action that might fuel a spiral of violence, with the risk of dragging the Middle East into an even greater military conflict," Pope Francis said on X.

Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps launched a barrage of drones and missiles at Israel late on Saturday, in response to the April 1 attack on the Iranian consulate in Damascus that killed several Iranian commanders.

Saying that no one should threaten the existence of others, Pope Francis appealed to all nations to take the side of

MT. RUANG ERUPTION DAMAGES 498 HOUSES, **PUBLIC FACILITIES**

JAKARTA - The National Disaster Mitigation Agency (BNPB) recorded at least 498 houses and three public facilities were damaged due to the eruption of Mount Ruang in Sitaro Islands District, North Sulawesi.

The head of BNPB's Disaster Data, Information and Communication Center, Abdul Muhari, on Sunday, said in addition to 135 mildly damaged houses and 363 moderately to severely damaged houses, two churches and one elementary school building in Tagulandang, Sitaro Islands were affected by the eruption.

The First Space Shuttle

Japan's labor ministry says more than 30 percent of recent graduates leave the workplace within three years.

Resignation agency services see booming business

A resignation agency service in Tokyo's Ota ward helps clients notify, on their behalf, companies that they wish to resign. The most common reasons given for quitting were duties and work condi-

Some clients say the work was not what they were promised before they joined the company, and that they were also worried about their career plans. Others say they were unable to attend their company's entrance ceremony due to having the wrong hair color, even though there were no dress code or hair requirements.

Woman left the company soon after joining

Yamamoto Nana joined a company as a new graduate two years ago, but left less than two months later. She says she had asked during training to be assigned to a specific section, but was assigned to a different section, so she quit.

A leading recruitment agency says thousands of new workers registered with the firm in April last year, marking a record high. The firm, which is headquartered in Osaka, launched a service five years ago to help people resign. It says that at the beginning, people said they were afraid of their bosses,

Measures: Companies need to change

A consulting firm specializing in human resources recruitment in Tokyo hires around 15 fresh graduates every year.

The firm has 180 workers. But in 2015, about half of the new recruits quit after less than one year. So the company decided two years ago to be honest about workplace issues starting at the recruitment stage. - NHK

RUSSIAN TROOPS ADVANCE IN EASTERN **UKRAINE**



Russian troops are making significant gains in Ukraine's eastern region near the Russian-occupied industrial town of Avdiivka, Ukraine's commanderin-chief, Oleksandr Syrskyi said on his Telegram channel.

"The situation on the eastern front has deteriorated significantly in recent days," said Syrskyi, adding that the Russian army intensified its offensive along several stretches of the more 1,000 kilometer-long front line after the presidential elections in Russia last month.

Warmer, drier weather also is playing a factor in Russia's surging offensive, allowing its heavy vehicles to move more quickly across the drying terrain.

Russia's defense ministry announced its troops had "liberated" the village of Pervomaiske in the Donetsk region, about 11 kilometers west of the largely destroyed town of Avdiivka, which was captured by Russia in mid-February.

13 Filipinos secure Olympic berths

MANILA - Thirteen Filipinos have secured berths at the Paris Olympics while more are hoping to qualify for Team Philippines, which is celebrating its 100th year participation in the Games.

The Philippine Olympic Committee (POC) has formalized negotiations with a month-long training camp in a worldclass facility at Les Arenes de Metz in France ahead of the July 26 to Aug. 11 Paris Olympics.

Those who earned direct qualification to Paris were pole vaulter Ernest John "EJ" Obiena; boxers Eumir Felix Marcial, Nesthy Petecio and Aira Villegas; weightlifters Vanessa Sarno, Erleen Ann Ando and John Febuar Ceniza; and gymnasts Carlos Yulo and Aleah Finnegan.

Tolentino said weightlifter Rosegie Ramos is technically qualified in the women's 49 kgs class although she is No. 11 in the world rankings after the Phuket World Cup, the final Olympic qualifying event for weightlifting.

The POC chief said swimmers Kyla Sanchez and Jarrod Hatch have qualified under the universality rule.

Hoping to qualify are Robyn Brown (athletics), Kurt Barbosa (taekwondo), Cris Nievarez (rowing), Joanie Delgaco (rowing), brothers Keisei and Shugen

AWEE ABAYARI: What was your ultimate goal in pursuing various degrees and how useful are they now in your present career?

ROD TUAZON: Other than the desire to learn new things, my goal in attaining multiple degrees is to enhance my ability to better serve my clients and the public in general, with knowledge and information that cater to their specific needs.

AWEE ABAYARI: What advice would you give to anyone on choosing a certain career?

ROD TUAZON: Follow your dreams, no matter what obstacles you may encounter. Pursue your goals that can ultimately provide you with happiness and a sense of fulfillment. When you enjoy what you do, everything else follows.

AWEE ABAYARI: What is your formula for success?

ROD TUAZON: I do not think there is one standardized formula for success. Some define success in terms of wealth, some relate it to being happy and fulfilled, and some link it to status and accomplishments. But the best way for me to describe success is being able to do what I want to do, when and where I want, with whom I want, and as much as I want.

AWEE ABAYARI: What is the current real estate situation?

ROD TUAZON: Real estate varies by location. Some areas may still experience fluctuations in prices depending on the affordability of buyers. In my area, I have seen reductions in prices, but not as drastic as we have seen in the past. The housing market is likely to continue to face the dual affordability constraints of high home prices and elevated interest rates.

AWEE ABAYARI: In your opinion, is home ownership still a good investment?

ROD TUAZON: Long term, owning a home is a good investment overall, but there is no guarantee like any other investments. When you rent, the money goes to the landlord whereas if you buy, you may build equity and benefit from the property appreciation. But if you are the type that dislikes permanency, owning a home may not be a choice.

AWEE ABAYARI: What has to happen to make housing more affordable?

ROD TUAZON: Increase the housing supply – but I realize it is not as simple as it sounds. There are many ways to solve the housing crisis and they vary depending on the area. To name a few, I think there should be more tax credits designed towards homeownership; more funding to local jurisdictions that can implement the housing program closer to home; revise zoning laws allowing denser development in high opportunity areas; and keep interest rates as low as economically feasible.

AWEE ABAYARI: What is the impact of the recent NAR settlement on buyers and sellers? Can commission rates be negotiated and when will it be implemented?

ROD TUAZON: Misinformation has been pervasive in the media over real estate commissions. Commission rates have always been negotiable long before the settlement. Realtors have traditionally been charging anywhere between 5% to 6%, but it is not a rule, but rather an industry practice. The settlement protects member-realtors by avoiding costly litigation and preserves cooperative compensation as an option for consumers looking to buy or sell a home – as long as such offers of compensation occur off the MLS.

AWEE ABAYARI: Please explain in simpler terms; Estate planning, living will, trust financial power of attorney etc.

ROD TUAZON: Estate planning is a process involving the counsel of professional advisors who are familiar with your goals and concerns, your assets and how they are owned, and your family structure. It can involve the services of a variety of professionals, including your lawyer, accountant, financial planner, life insurance advisor, banker and broker. It covers the transfer of property at death, as well as a variety of other personal matters, and

may or may not involve tax planning. In California, it includes the living trust, will, durable power of attorney and advance health care directive.

1. The main purpose of the Trust is to avoid probate of assets placed in the trust, and the time and expense involved in a probate proceeding. The Trust essentially acts in place of a will to make sure that your property passes to your beneficiaries with a minimum of hassle and expense. Another important advantage to the Trust is that it allows your designated successor Trustee to promptly take over the management of your affairs if you should become unable to manage your affairs due to illness, accident, Alzheimer's, etc. This avoids the potentially embarrassing, expensive, and lengthy court process of a conservatorship.

2. Your Will is commonly referred to as a "pour-over" will. Under the terms of the Will, any assets held by you which have not previously been transferred into your Trust will be added to the Trust at the time of your death (but may have to be subject to a probate administration in order to do so). The purpose of this is to make sure all of your assets (whether in your Trust or not) are distributed according to the dispositive plan set forth in the Trust.

3. The Durable Power of Attorney is a "general power of attorney" that gives your named agent the power to deal with any assets and may or may not give your agent broad powers to dispose of, sell, convey, and encumber your real and personal property. It becomes operational when you are incapacitated and can no longer make financial decisions.

4. The Advance Health Care Directive is also a power of attorney that gives your named Agents the power to make medical decisions, sign consents and/or releases with hospitals and/or doctors when you are deemed incapacitated or in a coma. It also acts as your "living will" for end-of-life decisions.

AWEE ABAYARI: Are all of the above "must" for all people? What are

ROD TUAZON: I would recommend all four above, but minimally the last three. Generally, everyone does not need a living trust, but there are many benefits for having one because it provides a flexible and efficient way to manage and distribute assets after the grantor's death while avoiding the cost and time-consuming probate process. But if probate avoidance is the only reason to set up a living trust, there are other ways to avoid probate, such as transfers on death (TOD) and setting up joint ownership, but I recommend consulting an attorney to learn the pros and cons of a stand-alone

AWEE ABAYARI: What are your tips for small business owners? **ROD TUAZON:** There are many tips available for small business owners available online, but to name a few: automate as many as possible, create an interactive website, stay organized and flexible, cut costs as needed to increase your bottom line, focus on your goals and limit distractions, take care of your customers first and foremost, find you niche, know your competitors, stay on top of marketing trends, be passionate about your business, and have lots of fun.

AWEE ABAYARI: Who is required to file income tax return? **ROD TUAZON:** Your requirement to file a tax return depends on your age, filing status, or income. Generally, most U.S. citizens and permanent residents who work in the United States need to file a tax return if they make more than a certain amount depending on their filing status on the last day of the year; have over \$400 (2023) in net earnings from self-employment; or had other situations that require them to file. Even if you make less than the filing threshold, you may want to file if you are eligible to claim refundable tax credits, such as earned income credit, child tax credit, etc.; you had federal income tax withheld; or made estimated payments.

• REAL ESTATE

Should I wait for the interest rates to go down before I buy a home? Why yes?Why not?

ROD TUAZON: Interest rates should not only be the only consideration when buying a home. Timing is everything in real estate. Understanding market conditions, interest rates, and your personal situation are essential in making an informed decision. There are windows of opportunity and homebuyers can easily miss these moments if they are not attuned to what is going on in the real estate market. They need to understand whether they are in a buyer's market (where they can negotiate the price down) or a seller's market (where competition is fierce). If it is a seller's market, speed and a strong offer are equally important. If it is a buyer's market, consider other factors such as interest rates, and whether or not prices continue to fall. There is no right formula of the timing, other than "buy low and sell high." To me, the right time to buy is when you are financially ready and there is a need to own a home.

I am selling my property through a realtor but so far, no offers are available. Many investors were interested but HOA does not allow it to be rented. I already agreed to lowering the price making me negative. What else can be done to sell it? Should I sell it first before buying another property?

ROD TUAZON: The HOA restriction is definitely limiting your ability to sell your property. And the market has slowed down because of rising interest rates. So, that is a double negative for you. Unless you have additional funds to cover buying another property without selling it, I suggest you sell first before you commit to buying a replacement. Try offering buyer incentives, such as paying some of their closing costs, or providing an allowance for newer flooring or amenities. But other than that, you just have to wait until the right buyer comes in. Remember, you only need one buyer, but it has to be the right one.

What do you think of those ads offering to buy your property in cash / as is / fast closing without hassle and no fees?

ROD TUAZON: Be careful of those ads, as they are looking for relatively cheap houses to buy so they can flip and make money from reselling them. But, as long as the offer is within your acceptable range, it would not hurt to take a look, but be cautious.

Will I be able to buy with only 3% down on a conventional loan for \$450,000-\$500,000 home? Is PMI required?

ROD TUAZON: Mortgages requiring 3% down is a special program with requirements, such as income limits and first time home buyer requirement (or have not owned a home in a few years), etc. The conventional 97 program is backed by Fannie Mae, and the down payment does not have to come from your savings. It can be a gift, grant, or other form of assistance. Because you are putting less than 20% down, you will need to pay private mortgage insurance (PMI) to protect the interest of

• ESTATE PLANNING

Do I need estate planning even if I only have one property and moderate cash plus life insurance? How much does it cost to create estate planning through a lawyer?

ROD TUAZON: Estate planning is not mandatory for everyone, but if you want to avoid probate on your real property, you need a living trust or TOD (see explanation above). You can create a living trust cost-free if you do it yourself and do not need to transfer real estate into the trust. But for a more complicated or larger estate, you may want to hire an attorney to advise you. This will likely cost at least \$900 and perhaps several thousand dollars, depending on your situation and location, and the attorney's expertise, experience and hourly rate. Attorneys set their own fees, so you may find one that is more expensive than others. If you can afford it, it may be worth paying because an attorney can ensure that forms are filled out and recorded properly, and help address complicated scenarios, such as transferring business ownership into the trust. If your situation changes, an attorney can advise you on updating and revising your trust. Mistakes may happen if you do not seek legal help. Sometimes mistakes can be costly because the trust was not set up properly or the trust was not funded correctly, which could end up in probate. Creating a trust without an attorney may be less expensive, bu doing so leaves the trust much more vulnerable to trust contests and other legal litigation.

Is it enough to put the name of my beneficiary in all my bank accounts and avoid having to do a living trust?

ROD TUAZON: Creating a living trust should always be a consideration depending on the type of assets you own. You do not need a living trust if you already have a named beneficiary in your bank accounts. If you have a large amount of money in the bank, I recommend putting it into a living trust. The specific accounts that will be included in a trust are always determined by the individual establishing the trust. While some accounts, like retirement, health savings accounts, life insurance policies, or vehicles should not be included in a trust, there are several account types that are beneficial. Some of the most common accounts included in a trust are safety deposit boxes, stocks and bonds, checking or savings accounts, and annuities.

How much money can a relative legally transfer money to my bank account in the U.S. without too much paperwork requirements?

ROD TUAZON: Your relatives can send an international wire of as much as they like, provided that it is within the maximum wire transfer limits set by your bank. The originating bank may require additional paperwork such as source of funds. However, you should be aware that transfers over \$10,000 will automatically be reported to the IRS.

US EMBASSY. JERUSALEM

Location: Israel, the West Bank, and Gaza

The U.S. Embassy in Jerusalem reminds U.S. citizens of the continued need for caution and increased personal security awareness as security incidents often take place without warning. The security environment remains complex and can change quickly depending on the political situation and recent

U.S. government employees and their family members are restricted from personal travel outside the greater Tel Aviv (including Herzliya, Netanya, and Even Yehuda), Jerusalem, and Be'er Sheva areas until further notice. U.S. government personnel are authorized to transit between these three areas for personal travel.

In response to security incidents and without advance notice, the U.S. Embassy may further restrict or prohibit U.S. government employees and their family members from traveling to certain areas of Israel (including the Old City of Jerusalem) and the West Bank.

U.S. citizens are encouraged to consult the current Travel Advisory and Country Information (www.travel.state.gov) for Israel, the West Bank, and Gaza, which advise U.S. citizens to be aware of the continuing risks of travel to Israel, the West Bank, and Gaza due to the security situation and heightened regional tensions and warns against travel to Gaza.

U.S. citizens can find additional information regarding steps to take in case of mortar and rocket fire in the Country Information for Israel, the West Bank,

Mortar and Rocket Fire: In the event of mortar or rocket fire, a "red alert" siren may be activated. Treat all such alerts as real; follow the instructions from local authorities and seek shelter immediately.

ILO discusses key recommendations to transform teaching profession

BRUSSELS (ILO News) - Manuela Tomei, ILO Assistant Director-General for governance, rights and dialogue, has highlighted the crucial role of education and teachers in a rapidly evolving world.

"Teachers can instil curiosity and a passion for understanding the world, and nurture the employers and workers of the future," she said at a session on teachers and the teaching profession.

At the Global Gateway High-level event on Education, co-hosted by the European Commission and the Belgian Presidency of the Council of the EU, she discussed some of the Recommendations of the UN Secretary-General's High-level panel on the teaching profession, which brought together ministries of education and labour, employers' organizations, teachers' unions, teachers, students, civil society and academia. The ILO and UNESCO led the Secretariat of the High-level panel.

The Recommendations, which are a direct follow-up to the United Nations Transforming Education Summit and which build on the ILO-UNESCO Recommendation concerning the Status of Teachers, set out a roadmap of actions to be considered within national contexts to address the urgent crisis in the teaching profession and the teacher shortages facing many parts of the world. - ILO



China kicks off biennial naval meeting amid mounting tensions at SCS

ANKARA - The Chinese navy on Sunday kicked off a biennial naval symposium in the port city of Qingdao, which will be attended, among others, by US Pacific Fleet Commander Admiral Stephen Koehler, state media reported.

Koehler will lead a US delegation to the 19th biennial meeting of the Western Pacific Naval Symposium (WPNS) hosted by the Peoples Liberation Army (PLA) navy, to meet "Chinese counterparts in Qingdao city of east China's Shandong province, South China Morning Post reported.

His visit to arch-rival China coincides with mounting tensions in the South China Sea involving several nations.

Over 180 navy representatives from 29 countries are participating in the four-day event themed "Seas of Shared Future," which coincides with commemorations for the PLA Navy's 75th anniversary

As a founding member of the WPNS, China has been committed to the principles of inclusiveness, equality and cooperation in its engagement with the affairs of the forum, said Qu Tao, a PLA Navy spokesperson.



China last hosted the WPNS meeting in 2014.

"The Chinese navy is willing to work together with its counterparts to promote global and regional

marine governance, tackle maritime safety risks and challenges, and advance building a marine community with a shared future," Qu said. (Anadolu)

NSC to probe reported influx of Chinese students in Cagayan

The National Security Council (NSC) is now looking into the reported influx of Chinese college students who reportedly enrolled in a local private school in Cagayan in the Philippines to determine if their presence is a security

NSC Assistant Director Jonathan Malaya said in a news forum that there is a lot of issues that they have to resolve as far as the presence of the Chinese students is concerned, including their number as it appears to be contradicting from the reports of the Bureau of Immigration (BI) and intelligence reports.

He said the BI reported only a hundred of Chinese students, but intelligence reports said a thousand. - PND

NASA, Japan advance space cooperation

NASA is working with the U.S. private sector and Japan to advance far more sophisticated vehicles that will allow astronauts to explore the moon's rugged south pole, where night lasts two weeks and temperatures can drop to minus 173 degrees Celsius.

NASA and Japan reached an agreement to send a pressurized rover to the moon. Japan will build a rover that will accommodate two astronauts for 30 days, allowing for greater exploration of the moon's surface.

UNESCO Director-General condemns killing of journalist Jam Saghir Ahmed Lar in Pakistan

Audrey Azoulay, Director-General of UNESCO, has condemned the killing of journalist Jam Saghir Ahmed Lar in the city of Khanpur, in the Punjab province of Pakistan on 14 March 2024

"I condemn the killing of Jam Saghir Ahmed Lar. Journalists must be protected from all forms of violence and authorities should assess threats thoroughly as a preventive measure. I urge the authorities to investigate this killing and bring the perpe-

Jam Saghir Ahmed Lar was a correspondent for the Daily Khabrain newspaper. He also contributed to other local news outlets in Khanpur, and he was active on social media posting about politics and current affairs. Lar had reportedly received death threats linked to his work. Reports suggest he was shot and killed by three armed individuals. - UNESCO

NASA leadership to visit Mexico, strengthen cooperation

Continuing their significant engagement with key government officials around the world to deepen ties and strengthen space collaboration, NASA Administrator Bill Nelson and Deputy Administrator Pam Melroy visit Mexico City on April 22 and April 23.

Nelson and Melroy met with senior Mexican government officials, including President Andrés Manuel López Obrador, pending confirmation, and Mexican Space Agency (AEM) leaders, to strengthen bilateral cooperation across a broad range of innovation and research areas, such as Earth science and exploration. Together, the two nations are working to achieve mutual goals of addressing climate change.

NIGERIA ROLLS OUT 'REVOLUTIONARY' **VACCINE AGAINST MENINGITIS**

Nigeria has become the first country to roll out a "revolutionary" five-inone vaccine against meningitis, the World Health Organization (WHO) said in a statement.

The Men5CV vaccine offers a powerful shield against the five major strains of the meningococcal bacteria - A, C, W, Y and X - which cause the disease. Known by the brand name MenFive, it provides broader protection than the vaccine currently used in much of Africa, which is only effective against

Meningitis is the inflammation of the tissues surrounding the brain and spinal cord and can be fatal. Symptoms often include headache, fever and stiff neck

The rollout in Nigeria represents one step closer towards the goal of total elimination by 2030, said Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, the WHO Director-General.

Xi. ex-Taiwan Pres Ma meet ahead of inauguration of island's new exec

ANKARA - Chinese President Xi Jinping recently met with former Taiwanese president Ma Ying-jeou in Beijing, marking the first time that a serving or former leader of the self-governed island has met with the Chinese top in nine years, state media reported.

The two last met in Singapore in Nov. 2015, when Ma was in office, marking the first cross-strait summit since the two sides split in 1949 after a civil war.

The former leader of Taiwan's main

opposition party, the Beijing-friendly Kuomintang, who was leading a group of Taiwanese students on a cultural exchange trip, wrapped up an 11-day "journey of peace" to China, following a landmark visit just more than a year ago.

His visit came amid soaring crossstrait tensions, with just more than a month to go before William Lai Ching-te of the independence-leaning ruling Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) takes over as Taiwan's president. - Anadolu





Did you know that too much sitting may be linked to a greater risk of health problems?

For example, spending most of the day sitting may contribute to heart disease, diabetes, and dementia.

"Whatever your age or ability, anything you can do to stand and move a little more might improve your health," said Dori Rosenberg, PhD, MPH, a senior investigator at the Kaiser Permanente Washington Health Research Institute.

Rosenberg is leading research on ways to help people spend less time sitting — for example, by using commercially available fitness trackers that give reminders to get up.

30 minutes a day makes a difference

In a recent clinical trial, Rosenberg and her colleagues helped older adults cut back on their time spent sitting during the day.

The researchers found that reducing sitting time by about 30 minutes daily led to better blood pressure measurements, which could reduce health risks.

For most people, it's easy to stand more. Here are tips to spend more time up and about each day, drawn from Rosenberg's research.

Stand during activities when you usually sit

- Read the newspaper, browse the internet, or catch up on emails while standing at a counter.
 - Set up a desk or writing space where you can stand.
- When doing hobbies such as knitting or playing board games, stand at a high table or counter for some of the time.
 - Stand for the first few minutes while talking on the phone.

The Filipino runners also paid a courtesy call on Philippine Ambassador to Italy Neal Imperial.
















Water Touches Everything

The ocean holds about 97 percent of Earth's water and covers 70 percent of our planet's surface. According to the United Nations, the ocean may be home to 50 to 80 percent of all life on Earth. Even if you live hundreds of miles from a coast, what happens in the ocean is fundamental to your life.


The major ocean basins – Atlantic, Pacific, Arctic, Indian, and Southern – shape our planet's climate and weather by absorbing, storing, and moving heat, water, and carbon dioxide. For nearly five decades, NASA missions have enabled researchers to observe from above and measure changes in the ocean across days, months, seasons, and years. Scientists use our satellite and sub-orbital data and climate models to study ocean dynamics, sea level rise, hydrological cycles, marine life, and the intersections of land and sea.

Over the past three years, NASA and its partners have launched three major satellite missions to study the ocean: SWOT, PACE, and Sentinel-6 Michael Freilich. These missions build on and complement existing missions and research campaigns to understand how and where the sea rises and falls, how currents move around the planet, and how the ocean and atmosphere exchange carbon dioxide, pollution, and nutrients.

In the ocean, some of the tiniest creatures have a huge impact. Phytoplankton are floating, microscopic organisms (algae are one example) that, like plants, turn sunlight, oxygen, and nutrients into food (through photosynthesis). They are the center of the aquatic food web, feeding everything from microscopic zooplankton to fish and shellfish – and therefore whales, birds, and other mammals who eat them. Scientists estimate that much of the oxygen in our atmosphere has been produced by phytoplankton, which are also responsible for double forms of the oxygen of the organization of the oxygen of the organization of the oxygen o for drawing down carbon dioxide from the air.

In the circle of life, whales eat creatures that eat phytoplankton, and the nutrient-rich feces (poop) from whales can then fuel phytoplankton growth. Whales also store carbon in their massive bodies, which eventually sinks to the seafloor when they die. According to researchers, a single whale can lock up as much carbon as dozens or hundrads of trees. It is one of the many ways nature removes some of the carbon dioxide that human activities produce. But all of our excess CO_g may be changing the oceans in ways that can upset the balanced ecosystems that support fish and whales.

The ocean is both a source and sink of greenhouse gases. Much of the heat that escapes the ocean comes in the form of evaporated water, one of the most potent greenhouse gases. That water vapor contributes to the formation of clouds, which shade the surface and supply water through precipitation—though they can also trap heat. Clouds are the key regulator of the planet's temperature.

WHAT'S THAT SWIRLY CLOUD EFFECT?

The spiraling cloud patterns (see image 5) are known as Von Kármán vortices. They form when fluid flow is disturbed by an object, such as when winds are diverted around a volcanic island poking above the ocean surface. The alternating direction of rotation in the air forms swirts in the clouds. These beautiful swifts can occur in both liquids and gases, making them a perfect way to illustrate motion and direction.

Water is common to all living things as we know them, and evidence of water has been found beyond Earth on Mars, comets, and meteorites. Because water seems like it could be universal, astrobiologist are looking for it in the atmosphere of exoplanets as an indicator that a planet could support life.

Closer to home, Jupiter's moon Europa may be hiding a saltwater ocean beneath its loy surface. It may be the most promising place in our solar system to find environments still suitable for some form of life beyond Earth. For this reason, NASA will soon send Europa Clipper to investigate.
